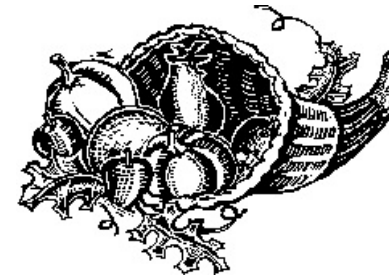

KENYA MISSION RESCUE

Our church has been supporting a group of young girls from the Maasai tribe in Kenya. The laws have changed in Kenya and female circumcision is now considered illegal, but the Maasai tribe continues to practice this and to marry their girls off very young, even as young as 8 years old. We are involved in rescuing girls from 2 local villages and putting them in school with boarding. Cost is approximately \$35 per month with approximately \$15 per month for books, school supplies, hygiene products, and uniforms that need to be replaced every other year. In November when the schools let out, we have been paying for a safe house for the girls to stay in until school resumes in January. If you are able to help support the girls monthly or would like to make an occasional/one time donation, please fill out a church envelope with your name and the amount being given, frequency and write Mission Rescue on the envelope. Detroit Partnership is a networking mechanism that provides training, networking and resourcing to promote racial, denominational and geographical unity among churches and Christian organizations in city and suburban Detroit, Michigan.

Detroit Partnership is the outcome of lessons learned from 1988 through 2006 with: (1) The Pastor's Development Program for 100 pastors in Mississippi, from 1988 to 2000; (2) The Skillman Foundation Faith-Based Initiative "A Call to Service" 47 churches serving 2300 children and youth in Detroit, MI, from 2001 to 2006; (3) Convoy of Hope Superbowl XL Day of Outreach serving 8725 citizens at Michigan State Fairground in Detroit, MI, in February 2006; (4) Al Kuhnle encouragement and financial support through City Light in 2007.

Detroit Partnership is establishing a role for itself of planting visions, perspective and ideas and then bringing leaders together to collaborate on the work necessary for those ideas to take on a life of their own, which allows for the freedom necessary to expand in God's timing and according to His plans.

Detroit Partnership is a place to prepare pastors, churches and faith-based organizations in the field of community philanthropy, an emerging field of sharing and giving in a neighborhood context.
